20 Course Description:

This course is designed to provide a guided nursing experience, knowledge and skills essential in preparation of professional nurses who are responsible to provide nursing care of adult patients with medical and surgical health conditions. It focuses on the bio-psycho-social responses of adults to actual and high risk conditions that affect their functional health patterns. This course provides the student with the practical experiences in the clinical settings to deliver nursing care for adult patients with altered functional health patterns. The nursing process will be utilized as a framework for care for the individuals and their families. The course aims at developing the decision-making and problem solving skills, and linking theory to practice.

27 Course Policies:

A- Attendance policies:
