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19. Course Description:

The course will provide supervised clinical training in a general hospital and a psychiatric unit. The focus of the training in both settings will be on; integrating the theoretical knowledge and evidenced based interventions from the mental health nursing theory course and computer based research findings; Utilize the steps of the nursing process within the therapeutic nurse-client relationship with the emphasis on the humanistic approach; the therapeutic use of self; and developing an open communication with health care providers' team to facilitate the client's healing process in a structured environment. Learning is enhanced through the direct interaction with clients experiencing physical illnesses, in crisis and psychiatric disorders. Students will participate in the activities of the unit giving individual care, group activities in collaboration with health care team members in the unit
