26. Course Requirements

27. Course Policies:

A- Attendance policies:

- Students must attend all classes of this course.
- Any student with the absence of 15% of the classes of any course, will not be allowed to sit for the final exam and will be given the university zero (F grade) in this course. **(15% of actual clinical encounters including the orientation two weeks will be four absences only).**
- In case (b) above, if a student submits an official sick report authenticated by the university clinic or an accepted excuse by the Dean of his/her faculty, the student will be considered as withdrawn from the course, and a "W" will be shown in the transcript for this course.
- Students are not allowed to come late to classes. Any student coming late will not be allowed to attend the class and he/she will be marked absent.

B- Absences from exams and submitting assignments on time:

- Failure to attend a course exam other than the final exam will result in zero marks unless the student provides an official acceptable excuse to the instructor who approves a make-up exam.



- Failure to attend the final exam will result in a zero mark unless the student presents an official acceptable excuse to the Dean of his/her faculty who approves an incomplete exam, normally scheduled to be conducted during the first two weeks of the successive semester.
- Assignments and projects should be submitted to the instructor on the due date or will be graded zero without an officially acceptable excuse.
